MS Semester by Semester Breakdown (32 credits)

The MS-SRS degree is designed to be completed in as few as two semesters. In order to complete the degree in two semesters, students must take four courses per semester. Below are the suggested degree plans for students who wish to take courses either on-ground or online. Students may deviate from what is suggested below but should be mindful that required courses may be only offered on-ground and/or online in particular semesters: POLS 7341 is only offered online and only offered in the fall. Other courses may be offered only online, on-ground, or both. There are also sample plans for completing the degree in one calendar year and two academic years.

MS with Co-Op Semester-by-Semester Breakdown (34 credits)

For students planning to pursue co-op, this extends the degree by six months and adds two credits to the degree plan. Students begin planning for co-op at the end of their first semester in the MS program. **Additionally, students must reserve one course (we recommend an online elective) to take while on co-op as students are prohibited from graduating on only co-op.** This translates to student taking one less course in either one of/the fall or spring semester. For students completing the degree in either a calendar year or two academic years, you should also save one course to take during your co-op semester. Note that this will have an effect of you taking one course for one semester, which is part- time status.
