

Call for Part Time Lecturer Applications
Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program
Northeastern University
Fall 2021, Online Course

The Northeastern University Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program seeks a part-time lecturer for Fall 2021 to teach our interdisciplinary course *Gender, Social Justice, and Transnational Activism*. This upper-level elective will be taught online, largely asynchronously, and is crosslisted among three units: Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies; Political Science; and Sociology. The ideal candidate will have a background in one or more of these fields and will have a demonstrated commitment to interdisciplinary instruction. Candidates must hold a PhD in a related field and experience in teaching higher education. A background in the specific subject matter and experience teaching online is preferred. PhD candidates with some experience teaching may be considered. Because the course will be taught online, we welcome applications from outside of the Boston-area.

The course explores themes and debates in feminist transnational theory, practice, and activism in contemporary contexts and how it has changed under socioeconomic, political, and cultural processes of globalization. Key elements of the course include interrogating differences relating to race, class, sexuality, national identity, and political economy in reckoning with possibilities for sustainable social justice. Qualified candidates will guide students through investigating knowledge production in different regional spaces, the pragmatics of political mobilization, the relationship between the local and the global, and the varying contours of "social justice." The course encourages students to imagine possible futures for transnational, feminist, intersectional justice.
