

**Call for Part Time Lecturer Applications Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program
Northeastern University
Spring 2022 Graduate Course**

The Northeastern University Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program seeks a part-time lecturer for Spring 2022 to teach our interdisciplinary graduate course in Queer Theory. This foundational graduate course will be taught in person on Northeastern's Boston campus and is crosslisted with Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies and Sociology. A PhD is required, ideally in Gender Studies or an allied field. The preferred candidate will have experience teaching queer studies in either an undergraduate or graduate setting and will have a demonstrated commitment to interdisciplinary instruction. Preference will be given to those with experience teaching graduate courses. We are offering a competitive adjunct salary for this position.

The course aims to familiarize students with the core texts and key debates that have shaped queer theory. The instructor should be able to trace the expansion of the term "queer" from its early contestation with LGBT identities and politics to its current use as a broad framework that designates non-normative modes of knowledge, cultural practices, and political activism. The instructor should be able to center the intersections between queer theory, feminism, and critical race theory. A strong familiarity with foundational queer and feminist texts is critical, as the course explores an expansive and radical contemporary queer politics, pushing beyond narrow constructions of identity politics, anti-discrimination policy, and rights-based reforms. This class will ultimately engage Queer Theory by means of a rich philosophical and political interrogation of the meaning and content of "queer."
